Governor Training - Preparing for the new Relationships and Health Curriculum 2020

Tuesday 21st January 2020

Facilitated by Ilse Brockling and Andrew Binnell

Audience: Governors and members of SLT

Focus: To inform Governors about the changes to the curriculum and statutory expectations for teaching Relationships and Health Education from September 2020. To ensure both Governors and SLT feel informed of the guidance, confident to lead the preparation for change, and supported in planning a curriculum that is appropriate to the pupil and community needs of the school.

The DfE have announced that two forms of Personal, Social and Health Education will become statutory for schools from September 2020. **Relationships Education** and **Health Education** will be taught alongside the Science curriculum, and other curriculum areas in which learning about physical health and mental wellbeing take place. Schools therefore need to become very clear on what is taught through their non-statutory Sex Education curriculum (if offered) and Relationships curriculum and Science curriculum to ensure statutory criteria are met, to avoid duplication, and to handle discussion around relationships sensitively.

We are holding a twilight session, from 6pm – 8pm, on **Preparing for the new Relationships and Health Curriculum 2020 for Governors and members of SLT**. We look at new expectations for the Primary curriculum for September 2020 - where changes have been made, and new topics that schools are expected to deliver in statutory guidance from DfE. We will explain the measures schools are expected to follow in order to prepare for delivering a curriculum which is suitable for your pupil and community needs, what Governors should know, and how they can support staff to ensure there is a seamless transition to the new curriculum. Considerations will include auditing needs, curriculum mapping, consultation of parents, subject leadership and policy writing. All delegates will gain clarity on curriculum expectations for Science, Relationships Education, Health Education and Sex Education, leading to schools confidently leading on these subjects and communicating their offer to parents.

Ilse Brockling is the Founder and CEO of The Children's Health Project CIC, a not for profit organisation that works with schools to develop a whole school curriculum and enrichment approach to mental and physical health, and offers an online Academy, including lessons plans, resources and training to support Subject Leadership and education of Health and Wellbeing through PSHE, PE, Science and Food Technology. Over 150 schools, from across the UK, are involved in The Children's Health Project in various forms. In 125 schools, The Children's Health Project has trained a Health Ambassador who leads on Health and Wellbeing Education, working in collaboration with Subject Leads and Senior Leaders. Ilse has worked as a teacher and consultant in Primary schools for 17 years, and consults for Impetus on PE, Health & Wellbeing and the new Relationships and Health Curriculum.

Andrew Binnell was a Headteacher of two Church of England Primary (VA) schools, leading the latter to make the journey from serious weaknesses to outstanding (2006 Ofsted Inspection) over a six year period. He founded Impetus Education Solutions Limited 4 years ago and now leads the company with the support of a team of 15 colleagues. His particular strengths lie in supporting schools in making the journey from good to outstanding utilising the vast range of experiences and resources he has developed in making his own journey as a leader.
