Since September 2019, inspection outcomes published in Essex for primary Schools have been as follows:

2 category 4 schools became category 3 schools
1 category 4 school became a category 2 school
2 category 3 schools became category 2 schools
3 category 2 schools became category 1 schools

25 category 2 schools remained as category 2 schools
1 category 4 school remained a category 4 school
3 category 3 schools remained as category 3 schools

3 category 1 schools became category 2 schools
1 category 1 school became a category 3 school
3 category 2 schools became category 4 schools
1 category 1 school became a category 3 school
1 category 2 school became a category 3 school
1 category 3 school became a category 4 school

This means that of the 47 schools identified, 8 schools improved their Ofsted grading, 29 remained the same and 10 declined.
