Focus: Developing written comprehension skills

- 1. Understanding written comprehension as a specific and challenging skill which needs clear modelling.
- 2. Developing a sequence of teaching reading that builds towards written comprehension.
- 3. Different types of written comprehension questions and how to teach them.

We will also discuss the 2017 SATs reading papers – please be prepared to discuss how your pupils found these papers, particularly in comparison to 2016 and the impact of any changes made in response to the 2016 outcomes.

There will be further sessions next year covering relevant up to the minute developments in English and providing opportunity for delegates to share practice. The specific dates for future sessions will be arranged with members of the group.
