

Updates from Ofsted and the DFE March 2023

Since 1 September 2022 inspection outcomes published in Essex for primary Schools and academies have been as follows:

49 schools that were category 2 schools remained as category 2 schools 2 schools that were category 4 schools remained as category 4 schools 4 schools that were category 1 schools remained as category 1 schools

4 schools that were category 3 schools are now category 2 schools 1 school that was a category 4 school is now a category 2 school

2 schools that were category 3 schools are now category 2 schools

3 schools that were category 1 schools are now category 2 schools 2 schools that were category 3 schools are now category 4 schools 2 schools that were category 2 schools are now category 3 schools

This means that of the 69 schools identified 55 remained the same, 7 improved and 7 declined.

- Ofsted will be publishing further parts of their research review for the early years. Subsequent reviews will explore the 7 areas of learning in the Early Years Foundation Stage, taking into account that the areas of learning are all interconnected.
- Ofsted will continue their focus on communication and language.
- Ofsted are awaiting the results of the consultation on updating and improving the Level 3 criteria for Early Years Educators. These criteria need to capture the right things and be brought up to date.

The Department for Education (DfE) is offering a grant of £1,200 for eligible state-funded schools and colleges in England to train a senior mental health lead to develop and implement a whole school or college approach to mental health and wellbeing. Eligible schools and colleges are now able to apply for a senior mental health lead training grant to commence training by 31 July 2023. Grants will be provided to cover (or contribute to) the cost of attending a quality assured course and may also be used to hire supply staff while leads are engaged in learning.
